#### Foxcatcher Endurance General Information

**Masks:** Must be worn at all times. Non-compliant will be asked to leave and forfeit entry.

Temperature Check: Will be required daily for ALL PERSONS on the grounds. We will have colored wrist bands for each day indicating that your temperature is normal. It will include all persons entering the property competitors, crew, officials, vets and organizing committee. No spectators or guests will be permitted.

Entries may be mailed or emailed to the secretary. Complete entry with all documents and full payment must be received by the secretary on or before 3/24/2021. Entries received after 3/26/2021 may be accepted at management discretion with a \$50.00 late fee. We are not able to accept credit cards unless you pay online via PayPal (you do not need a PayPal account to do so). \*Complete entry includes- current copy of negative Coggins, Liability Releases -Fair Hill International 2021 competition year (this is for you and everyone in your party). Fair Hill International Inc./Foxcatcher Endurance Release, All of these are in this entry packet some will be for AREC riders. Some for all AERC, ECTRA, and crew PLEASE look through and sign away! Copy of AERC card, and payment in full.

Cancellations: Entry fees are refundable with written notice provided to secretary and received prior to 3/26/2021 less a \$50.00 office fee. After 3/26/2021, refunds will need written certification from vet or doctor received prior to 4/02/2021. All refunds will not be distributed until 10 days following the completion of the event.

**Coagins:** All entries must show a negative Coggins within the year.

Corrals/High-Tie/Portable Fencing: Management reserves the right to ask any rider to leave without entry fee refund if your horse(s) are not properly contained. Riders are responsible for properly securing their horses at the ride site. With regard to electric fences, bear in mind that many horses could be blanketed at this time of year and are not likely to feel the electric through the blanket.

Grounds: Base Camp is located in a field off of Big Elk Chapel & Gallaher Road. Porta johns and water tank are provided. There are no campfires permitted. There is NO fee for camping on the grounds for 4/1-3, 2021 Alternate permanent stabling may be available on NRMA grounds approximately 1 mile from the base camp (no round pens). Campsite hookups adjacent to permanent stabling may be available w/advance reservations through Fair Hill NRMA Office, 410-398-1246 (spaces fill guickly).

Trails/Grounds: This ride is held on state property and is open to the public. You may see hikers, riders, bikers, loggers, dog walkers, carriages. etc. Please be courteous to other park users and leave the campground as you found it. Terrain is rolling hills, gravel/dirt roads (most not open to cars), and numerous water crossings. Trail is well marked with signs, ribbons, and ground flags. Radio spotters will be on course reporting rider locations as they pass radio check points. Spotters and other volunteers are not responsible for knowing the course. Note: The Fair Hill NRMA rangers are authorized to close the course if severe weather/safety issues warrant. In this case no refund applies.

Ride Briefina: My goal is a zoom meeting 03/30/2021 in the evening. Please look for more information on web page as we get closer.

Farrier/ Treatment Vet: A farrier and treatment vet will be available at rider expense. PLEASE... before leaving the ride make arrangements for payment to the provider of any veterinary and/or farrier expenses incurred.

Helmets: ASTM/SEI helmets are required by all riders and must be properly fastened when mounted.

Start Time: Ride & Tie / Equathon will start approximately 15 to 20 minutes after the other distances. I will post more information about start times for all of you as ride numbers become available.

The 25 & 50 mile are scheduled to start at 7 a.m. The 10 mile will start at 7:30 am. The start times and locations will be different for each distance. Please refer to AERC rules for ride times. All start times and locations will be clearly marked. These times are subject to change depending on rider count for each distance.

Vet: Pre-Ride Vet inspection at base camp is scheduled Friday after 1 pm. There are no scheduled Pre-Ride inspections on Saturday. All vet checks are at the base camp. 50 Milers will only have a gate and go in the first loop where crewing is allowed. Directions will be provided for your crew. Information can be downloaded from the Foxcatcher website

Medical: Ride management strongly encourages all riders to either wear a web-assisted Road ID type bracelet or a medical card in an armband at all times on the trail. This will assist medical personnel in case of emergency.

## 2021 COMPETITION YEAR WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

(for ALL persons on grounds)

For and in consideration of Fair Hill International ("FHI") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, owner, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a FHI event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities; I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

**A. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK:** I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any FHI Event involves risks and dangers including, with-out limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases),trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of FHI Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("**Risks**").

**B. ASSUMPTION OF RISK:** I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in FHI Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any FHI Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any FHI Event.

**C. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY:** In conjunction with my participation in any FHI Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: FHI members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any FHI Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the FHI Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a FHI Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (Individually and Collectively, the "Released Parties" or "Event Organizers"), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature ("Liability") which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the FHI Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.

D. COMPLETE AGREEMENT AND SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: This Agreement represents the complete understanding between the parties regarding these issues and no oral representations, statements or inducements have been made apart from this Agreement. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be unlawful, void, or for any reason unenforceable, then that provision shall be deemed severable from this Agreement and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of any remaining provisions. I HAVE CAREFULLY READ THIS DOCUMENT IN ITS ENTIRETY, UNDERSTAND ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS, AND KNOW IT CONTAINS AN ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND WAIVER FROM LIABILITY, AS WELL AS A HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION OBLIGATIONS.

I understand that horseback riding is an inherently dangerous activity and am aware that 1) the ride involves being in areas for extended periods of time far from communications, transportation, medical and veterinary assistance; 2) that these areas have many natural and man-made hazards, which ride management cannot anticipate, modify, or eliminate; 3) that both my own horse and those of other contestants can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable, and can panic, bite, rear, kick, strike, stumble or fall; 4) that as a result of participating in the ride, I or my horse may be injured, die, or my property damaged. I agree to take full responsibility for myself and my horse and for any other party or animal that accompanies me; I recognize that the ride is a strenuous activity and I represent that I and my horse are in adequate physical and mental condition to participate. I recognize that my participation in the ride is voluntary.

## RULES OF RIDE & TIE

Violation of any rule may result in disqualification.

1. Each team will consist of two persons who are current members of the Ride and Tie Association and one horse. Throughout these Rules "horse" means "horse, pony or mule."

2. The horse must be at least five years old.

3. No pregnant or lactating mares will be allowed to compete.

4. No foreign substance or medication may be given or administered to any horse within 72 hours before starting the event or one hour after finishing the event. This includes ointments or solutions for topical use that contain local anesthetics All medications administered during the two weeks prior to the race must be declared in writing to the veterinarian conducting the pre-race examination.

5. All horses must be submitted for a pre-race examination.

6. There will be a predetermined number of vet checks where the horses will be observed and examined. There will be no mandatory time holds. Cut-off time limits for each check point may be established. Pulse, respiration, mucous membrane color and capillary refill, surface factors, attitude and soundness will be considered as part of the criteria for passing through to the next check. Vet check criteria will be announced prior to the races start and will be determined by the Head Veterinarian after consideration of weather, terrain, and other factors.

7. All horses must be presented to the veterinarians for a post-race veterinary examination within one hour of finishing. Horses must pass this examination for any member of that team to be eligible for completion awards. No abuse of a horse will be tolerated.

8. All decisions of the Veterinarian staff regarding the health and safety of the horse are final.

9. Artificial ties are illegal. Hand ties may be allowed at the Race Director's discretion. Any decision to allow hand ties will be announced at the pre-race briefing.

10. Each team must tie its horse and switch from rider to runner and runner to rider at least six (6) times during an event. Teams may tie as many times as they desire anywhere along the trail as long as the ties do not obstruct the trail or are not made in designated "No Tie Areas." A required tie will occur at each vet check. A team must exchange at least twice between vet checks. Where vet checks are so close that two exchanges may be impractical, the Race Director may allow one exchange between two specific vet checks. If a runner on a team has not been overtaken by his partner before the next vet check, then the runner must wait at the vet check for his/her partner to arrive in order to meet the required vet check tie.

11. With the exception of securing a loose horse, no person other than the team members and designated race officials may handle a team's horse on the trail during the race. Designated team crew may work with the horse at any vet check specified by race officials to be open to crews. Race officials may require crew to obtain a pass. Only contestants may take a horse through the vet checks during the race.

12. It is not permissible for both members of a team to use their horse at the same time for forward movement. "Tailing" (meaning the rider dismounts, grips the horse's tail and allows the horse to pull him/her) is allowed but it is not permissible for one team member to ride while another tails.

13. No pacing by an un-entered horse or runner is allowed for any contestant.

14. Riders shall be responsible for their horse's behavior prior to and during the event. If, at the discretion of the race management, any horse becomes unruly or jeopardizes the safety of other competitors, the team may be disqualified from the event.

15. Teams must pass and report to any trail marshals who are positioned along the course. Competitors inadvertently off course must return to the point at which they left the marked trail and complete the course correctly. Teams must stay on the marked trail.

16. Any protest must be filed in writing with the Race Director within two hours of the completion of the race. Prior to the start of the awards ceremony, the Race Director shall decide on the protest. An appeal of his decisions must be filed in writing within seven days to the President of the Ride and Tie Association, whose final decision cannot be appealed.

17. A team has not completed the race until both human teammates and their horse have reached the finish line.

18. These rules apply to a sanctioned race. A race may be of any distance, but to be sanctioned there must be a Ride & Tie race of at least 20 miles in length included within the same event.

19. Competitors under 16 years of age must wear approved safety helmets while mounted during a race (helmet approval by AHSA, PCA, ANSIZ90.4, or Snell)

## What Is Equathon?

Another exciting option of Ride & Tie is the Equathon. Grab your favorite endurance rider or runner and compete in this fast-growing sport! It's kind of like a Ride & Tie, but the rider never has to get off the horse. Basically the horse and rider do the ride, say a 12-mile loop, reach pulse criteria, then the runner tackles the 12-mile loop. Sounds like fun, right! If you are really an exercise fanatic, you can do the Equathon as a solo or "Iron" team. Run your horse in the 12-mile race, jump off and allow your horse to reach pulse criteria, then run the12 miles on foot. Now doesn't that sound like a hoot?
