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LEGAL RELEASE TO BE SIGNED BY ALL ENTERING THE RIDE CAMP & TRAILS, DO NOT SIGN UNTIL YOU READ:

As a participant, crew, volunteer, ride personnel, or guest in the Yellowhammer Endurance Ride (May 14-15 2021) I agree to abide by the rules of the sanctioning organizations AERC, SERA, SEDRA, Ride and Tie, & the Yellowhammer Ride Management. I hereby knowingly execute this waiver of the right to sue & do hereby agree to assume all risks associated with participation in the ride, permitted by the United States Forest Service, Talladega National Forest, Shoal Creek Ranger District, or in riding on the premises. I agree that my participation in the ride involves certain inherent risks, which include but are not limited to the following: (1) horseback riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas can have many natural and man-made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate, these hazardous surface/subsurface conditions including such things as rocks, rocks, puddles, streams, fences, jumps and/or other hard objects and/or holes, divots, ledges which could cause an equine to trip and/or fall and/or could strike a participant who falls from or is thrown from an equine; (2) that horses can behave in unpredictable ways which can result in accidents to anyone at any time, resulting in injury, severe injury, or death; (3) that an equine's reactions to sound, movements, objects, vehicles, persons, animals, scents or insects cannot be predicted. I agree to take full responsibility for myself/my child, & the animal I/my child is riding. I will hold harmless these AERC, SERA, SEDRA, Ride and Tie its officers & all individual members thereof, the United States Forest Service, its employees, all ride personnel, including volunteers and veterinarians, and all property owners over whose land the ride crosses, their representatives, successors and assigns, for any accident, injury or loss that might occur due to my participation in this ride, & free from all liability for such injury or loss, including that due to negligence not caused by wanton or willful misconduct of the US Forest Service or Ride Management & personnel. This release extends to all claims of every kind & nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, & I expressly waive any benefits that I may otherwise have under provisions of law of the State of Alabama relating to the release of known claims. I understand that this release constitutes a limitation on my legal rights. Under Alabama Law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risk of equine activities, pursuant to the Equine Activities Liability Protection Act. I hereby certify that my horse is not under the influence of medication & will not be treated with or given any medications prohibited by AERC rules. I also hereby give permission to AERC or its duly appointed agent to take any appropriate action deemed necessary to check for possible administration of drugs to my horse. The undersigned verifies acceptance of risks & responsibilities for rider's and horses' conditions & certifies that all information on this form is correct to the best of his/her knowledge. THIS AGREEMENT IS BINDING UPON MYSELF, MY SPOUSE, LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES, HEIRS, EXECUTORS AND ASSIGNS. I HAVE READ THE ABOVE, UNDERSTAND IT, AND AGREE TO ABIDE BY THIS.

Potentially Useful Information
May 20-21, 2022



Base Camp: Talladega National Forest Warden Station Horse Camp: Just off Rt 532, Fruithurst, AL 36262. Primitive camping only. Plenty of trees to high tie. Water spigots at a few locations in camp. Park tightly to ensure space for all. Warden Station Horse Camp contains several camping loops. The first loop on the right is reserved for day riders who will share the trails with us, so please do not camp there. The first loop on the left is the vet check & registration area, and is reserved for volunteers. There is a loop to the right, & two more loops further down on the left. Showers are available 1 mi down the road for a small fee.

Camping Fee: \$6 camping fee per night. \$3 if you just ride for the day. Fill out envelope & drop in pipe at the base camp. Display your stub so that the USFS Rangers will not fine you.

Directions from I 20 in Alabama: take the exit 199 for SR- 9 North toward Heflin. Turn right onto State Route 4, Then turn left on Hwy 78. From Hwy 78 you will turn North onto County Road 61. Look for the AERC ride sign that is across the road from the Cane Creek Fire Station. **TURN LEFT HERE.** Travel +/- 7-8 miles north on County Road 61. Make a right onto County Road 532 (There is a sign for Coleman Lake/Warden Station Horse Camp). All roads are paved & easy to travel. Horse camp entrance will be 100 yards on your right.

Directions from I 20 in Georgia: from I 20 in GA, take the exit 5 onto SR- 100 towards Tallapoosa. Turn Right. Travel +/- 5mi turn left onto US 78. Travel +/- 9mi to Fruithurst, continue another 4mi until you see Cane Creek Fire Station on your left. Turn right om County Road 61. Travel +/- 8.5mi to County Road 532 (There is a sign for Coleman Lake/Warden Station Horse Camp). All roads are paved & easy to travel. Horse camp is 100 yards on your right.

Trails: There are 5 loops of technical trail, with mostly rolling hills, with lots of elevation change, and some steeper inclines in the beautiful Talladega National Forest. Single track forest trails, and old roadbeds. There is natural water, water crossings, & there will be water placed on trail at strategic points. It is a mountainous area with some rock, so hoof protection is recommended. We have Ham Radio operators placed at various check points on trails for your safety.

Farrier: There will be a farrier available at ride camp.
