Liability Release

This release must be signed and returned with your ride entry. No cross-outs or additions are permitted.

As a participant in a ride sponsored by the Ride and Tie Association, I agree to abide by the rules of the Ride & Tie Association.

In consideration for permission to enter and participate in the Ride and Ties, I do hereby for myself, my heirs and assigns, release and hold harmless ride management, ride personnel, all property owners over whose land the ride crosses, the Ride & Tie Association, their agents, officers, servants, employees and officials, from all claims, demands, actions and causes of action of any kind, for injury or death sustained by me or my horse, and damage to my property, incurred during this ride, arising from negligence or any other fault. "Ride" includes from the time I and my horse arrive at base camp until the time that we leave the premises, as well as the actual event. "Horse" means the animal(s) I am riding, driving, or have entered.

I understand that horseback riding is an inherently dangerous activity and am aware that 1) the ride involves being in areas for extended periods of time far from communications, transportation, medical and veterinary assistance; 2) that these areas have many natural and man-made hazards, which ride management cannot anticipate, modify, or eliminate; 3) that both my own horse and those of other contestants can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable, and can panic, bite, rear, kick, strike, stumble or fall; 4) that as a result of participating in the ride, I or my horse may be injured, die, or my property damaged.

I agree to take full responsibility for myself and my horse and for any other party or animal that accompanies me; I recognize that the ride is a strenuous activity and I represent that I and my horse are in adequate physical and mental condition to participate. I recognize that my participation in the ride is voluntary.

CHESAPEAKE TRAIL RIDING CLUB 25 MILE COMPETITIVE TRAIL RIDE AND DRIVE AND 13-MILE CDR (Conditioning Distance Ride) AND DRIVE

LOCATION: Beautiful Fair Hill DNR, Maryland, upper barn area

DATE: Sunday, June 21, 2026

TIME: Judging for the CTR begins Saturday at 5pm (if you are staying overnight) and Sunday at 6:30am (if you are shipping in). **Riders in the 25 MUST be on site no later than 6:30am Sunday.** The ride starts as soon as judging is complete. CDR judging begins at 8am. The ride starts as soon as judging is complete.

ENTRY FEE: 13 Mile CDR OR CDD \$75.00 per entry Jrs \$35.00 per entry

25 Mile CTR OR CTD \$100.00 per entry Jrs \$50.00 per entry

Entry must be confirmed no later than June 18, 2026. Ride entry is limited to 50 horses and riders. **No refunds for cancellations after June 12, 2026.**

Stalls and bedding (every distance) for Saturday are \$38.00 per night and arrangements must be made through ride management prior to June 12, 2026. A separate deposit check for \$25.00 must accompany stall reservations. Please note if entering online please bring a separate stall deposit check with you to Fair Hill and give to the ride secretary. This check will be destroyed or returned when your stall is cleaned, swept and inspected and your ride evaluation turned in, otherwise we will cash it. Camping pads are \$35.00 and must be reserved through Fair Hill directly by June 12, 2026.

DETAILS: The CDR and 25 Mile rides and Drives are ECTRA (Eastern Competitive Trail Riding Association) sanctioned and will be conducted according to all rules and regulations set out by ECTRA. Helmets are required when mounted.

AWARDS: CDR Riders and Drivers will receive participation awards.

25 Mile riders and Drivers will receive awards for participation and placement awards.

FOOD: No food Saturday night! Donuts and coffee Sunday AM, and lunch Sunday afternoon for all competitors.

ELIGIBILITY: For all distances, according to ECTRA guidelines, open to all equines 4 years (48 months) and older. Current negative coggins must accompany your ride entry or be provided at check-in.

JUDGING: Is in accordance with rules and regulations of ECTRA. It is the responsibility of all riders and drivers to know these rules. Rulebooks are available from Marilyn Miles, PO Box 76, Clarksville, NY 12041 or access from website: www.ECTRA.org.

JUDGES: TBD

FARRIER: We do not have farrier services. Any type shoes or Easyboots may be used; pads are optional. SHOES ARE STRONGLY RECOMMENDED, there is a lot of road bed on the Spring ride.

DISQUALIFICATION: Will occur if any rider or driver is found riding or driving anywhere other than the marked trail; for use of any drugs before, during or after the ride prior to final judging; or at the discretion of management or judges should a situation warrant. See ECTRA handbook pertaining to disqualification.

Any horse requiring treatment of any kind, or any horse that the judges deem necessary to treat and the rider/owner refuses treatment will be disqualified. Management retains the right to drug test each day.

TIME: Ride and drive time Sunday for the 25-mile CTR is 4:20 to 4:50. There **will be a 30-minute hold!** Riders and drivers more than 30 minutes early or late will be disqualified. Ride time for the CDR will be 2:00 to 2:30. No penalties for the 30-minute window.

TRAIL: Will be marked with surveyor's tape, arrows and signs. Mileage markers will appear every 5 miles and each mile for the final 5 miles. **The trail covers beautiful rolling hunt country in Fair Hill DNR. The footing is mostly on roadbeds in the Spring. Being good stewards of our trails and your safety requires this.**

HOLDS: Are in camp and **canopies are recommended as there is no shade in this area.**

TRAIL CONDUCT: Riders should ask to pass only if safe to do so and should avoid passing at a canter or a gallop. Red ribbons in tails of kickers; yellow ribbons in tails of stallions.

RIDE BRIEFING: TO BE HELD NEAR MY TRAILER AT 7PM.

MISCELLANEOUS: No pleasure riding on trails during the ride except for drag riders. Dogs must always be on a leash. Rider should provide own buckets, feed and hay and grooming items. No leg protection or bandages. No internal or external medications are allowed. Note that VICKS, SWAT cream and Vaseline fall into this category. Fly repellents, electrolytes, grooming products and water at ordinary temperatures may be used. *NO HOSING OF HORSES ALLOWED.* ASTM/SEI approved helmets are mandatory and must be used whenever mounted on the horse or in the cart. *NO BAREBACK RIDING.*

REFUNDS: Cancellations on or before June 12, 2026, **only a \$25.00 admin fee will NOT be refunded.** **Cancellations after June 12, 2026, no refunds.** If entries warrant, a waiting list will be maintained; refunds are contingent on your place being filled from the waiting list. Refunds will be mailed after the ride.

INFORMATION SHEET

Welcome to the 2026 Chesapeake rides! We are excited to offer the best experience we can in the competition. Fair Hill NRMA is a 5800 acre park that is a multi-use facility. On these trails you will encounter the public in various forms. Bikers, Hikers and Bird watchers are most common. Please be polite and courteous as you interact with them. We are here by invitation only.

When you arrive, you will be greeted by our ride Secretary Denise Evans. She will give you your ride packet and tell you what stall you are in. She will also tell you your start time. If you are arriving the day before you will need to be on the grounds not later than 6 pm to vet that evening. Otherwise, you will vet in the am. **You must be here no later than 6:30 am for the 25 and no later than 7:30 am for the 13.**

This year when you unload you may not pull in between the barns. Please do not drive on the grass between the barns at Fair Hill. We are vetting in that area, and I do not want any traffic. I apologize in advance for the inconvenience. You might want to bring a wagon of some sort to transport your straw to your stall and your used straw to the manure pile and to carry all your items to the hold. You may wish to bring a canopy if you are doing the 25 as there is no shade in the hold area.

If you are arriving Saturday, you may arrive anytime during Saturday. But don't expect to get into your stall unless Denise is there.

If you are arriving on the morning of the ride you need to be on the premises by no later than 6:30am FOR THE 25 MILES AND 7:30 AM FOR 13 MILER.

We are following the customary rules for CTR and CDR. See below for specific rules for pass/fail.

RULES FOR PASS/FAIL DIVISION (P/F)

Mileage will count towards Mileage Only. Ride time window would be opened up to include the Maximum or Minimum time before a participant is eliminated. Horses in this Division will present one time only for a complete final exam and will present in order of finish. Both initial and final exams are to be performed in the exact same manner. Every category is to be evaluated and the findings indicated with use of either "P" for Pass or "F" for Fail classification. No other notifications are required to be written on the score sheet with the exception of a reason for failure. A "Fail" classification indicates that the equine is unfit in regards to the welfare of the equine to continue in competition or to receive a completion...Failure in any category is grounds for elimination. All trot outs will be performed in an "out and back" manner. Grade 3 Lameness is grounds for elimination. Failure to meet final Pulse criteria within ECTRA allowable time is grounds for elimination...Judges are to write a final Pass or Fail classification on the bottom of the Score Sheet at the end of the final evaluation. All types of hoof and leg protection are allowable. Judge(s) may request to observe any area covered by attached strap, keeper or gaiter at any time. Leg protection devices are permissible. Leg is defined as all structures above and including the coronet band. Examples of these devices include but are not limited to bell boots, splint boots or wraps. Judge(s) may request to observe covered areas at any time and will require that they **MUST** be removed before presenting the horse for pre-ride, post-ride and safety hold check inspections.

Event distances and time: (There are not your start times)

13 Miles 2:00 – 2:30 (Window of time on the trail, not the time the ride starts)

25 Miles 4:20 to 4:50 Hold is 30 minutes. (Window of time to complete the trail, not the time the ride starts)

The hold will be 30 minutes and will be tack off unless the vet allows differently.

There is one trail of 12.5 miles. Please do not be disparaging if the mileage is not exact, Fair Hill is under construction and our trails have had to adapt in very short order. There are no hazards to mark. There is good natural water on the trails. These Spring trails are designed for wet use. They are mostly roads and a lot of gravel. Please be prepared to use hoof protection.

The last 5 miles are marked in accordance with ECTRA guidelines 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 to go. The trails are marked with Surveyors flags and stakes.

The order of Rides to start will be:

The 25 milers will begin the process of being sent out at 7:30 am

The 13-mile ride will be released after a break from the 25s. Usually around 8:15 or 8:30 am

Please pay attention to the signage around the barn area. This is critical to the success of this ride! These signs will tell you a lot about where you need to be.

If you wish to make changes to your entry, they must be received prior to 3 pm the day before. The only changes made after 3 pm will be to withdraw your horse completely.

There will be no crewing near the vet areas.

You will enter and exit at the given signed places. Please pay attention to the signs. Please be patient with us and each other.

We will be offering a bagged lunch and assorted breakfast items. We will most likely have coffee if you wish, and we may offer some individually packaged snacks. We will be offering drinks and always have a supply of bottled water for anyone in need. Please don't hesitate to ask if you need something!

Ride Briefing: Will be held in person this year as soon as the vetting is complete on Saturday. If you are arriving on Sunday morning, please use this Information Sheet as your Ride Briefing. Feel free to ask Cate Peloquin (Ride Manager) any questions you may have.


